The United Nations Conference on Environment and Development (UNCED) or Earth Summit held in Rio de Janeiro in June 1992 saw the largest gathering of world leaders ever. A total of 178 Governments approved and adopted Agenda 21 - a Programme of Action for Sustainable Development into the 21st Century under which world governments agreed to promote sustainable development nationally and in international cooperation.

7. Strengthening the Role of Farmers.
8. Strengthening the Role of Non-Governmental Organisations: Partners for Sustainable Development
9. Strengthening the Role of Business and Industry.
